The volunteers

On Saturday a strong meeting of volunteers, preparatory to going to Lytham, was held at Newchurch, when the Bacup, Acrington, Haslingden and Ramsbottom corps were present. The men were marched near to the residence of Captain Patrick at Cloughfield (sic), and there put through a number of evolutions, after which they were regaled with refreshments at the Royal and Duke of Buccleuch Inns, Waterfoot.

The Duke's Own Yeomanry

The *London Gazette*, on Tuesday, announces that Captain William Edward Royds, of the Duke of Lancaster's Own Yeomanry Cavalry, is appointed Supernumerary Captain of that regiment; that Lieutenant Charles Patrick is appointed Captain, vice Royds; and that Cornet Clement Molyneux Royds is appointed Lieutenant, vice Patrick.
