

HIGHER CLOUGHFOLD RAWTENSTALL



350 years ago, we have the first authentic date in connection with any gathering of Independents in the vicinity of Cloughfold, Lancashire – 1672*.

It was in that very year that a little company of believers gathered for the first time (probably in a barn owned by one John Pickop of Dedwinclough) to worship openly, independently, as dissenters.

For a while at least those who refused to bow to a High Church with its Prayer Book and powerful priesthood could worship – near to where Sion Baptist Church now stands - without the fear of persecution and imprisonment.

It was a serious thing for our forebears to go to church. They were deemed to be holding an illegal "conventicle" for which dissenters could be fined, jailed or worse.

They fought for the right enshrined in Scripture to gather together as believers, the equal of anyone else. Let us never forget that we, three- and- one-half centuries on, enjoy the privilege today of unhindered worship.
